Her connection to Wray Church goes back to 1882 when, as a sixteen year old, Beatrix Potter, whilst staying at Wray Castle, first met the then vicar and later National Trust co founder, Hardwicke Rawnsley. In her diary Beatrix described him conducting a very original Harvest Festival with the blessing of the tools. We have a very significant little church in our midst!
