As of course you know, many people who live and work here are involved in the tourist industry in one way or another, and that is also true of the churches. We get visitors from all over the world. The churches at Hawkshead, Sawrey, Rusland and Satterthwaite are all kept open during the day and all receive a significant number of visitors.

People visit churches on holiday for all sorts of different reasons. It may be something you have done yourself in other places. You go into a church building, perhaps because it is an attractive building, perhaps because it is something to do, perhaps because it is cool inside on a hot day or dry when it is raining. You look around, and then, because your feet are tired, you have a little sit down and a quiet moment.

And then maybe what you find is that the experience is somehow more than the sum of its parts. You are doing more than just sitting quietly in an old building.

This is perhaps partly because we so rarely sit quietly and do nothing, or because, no matter what we believe, it is moving to be in a building that has been set aside for prayer and worship, a building that exists because of a belief that there is more to life than our day-to-day concerns. And it is a place where many people before us have found something similar, and have done so for generations. As a Christian I believe that this is one of the ways in which God speaks to us.

It is our hope and prayer that people find something significant in our churches, whatever they choose to call it. John.

CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 2014

House-to-house collections this year produced £1226.85 in Hawkshead parish and £198.44 in Sawrey parish, giving a total of £1425.29. To this must be added £115 raised at the "Cathedrals and Capuchinos" talk in the Market Hall on 1 May, which means that we have been able to send Christian Aid a total of £1540.29. The Gift Aid forms from both the collections and the talk will enable Christian Aid to claim back £138.26 from HM Customs & Revenue taking our total up to £1,675.84. With the £961.75 raised at Lent Lunches (see the May edition of The Link), this means that our two parishes have provided Christian Aid with £2,636.59 in 2014.

THE HAWKSHEAD MEDICAL PRACTICE has just passed an audit from the Care Quality Commission. CQC inspectors visit all health services across England to ensure practices are meeting the national standards of quality and safety and it was Hawkshead's turn on the 1st May. The audit lasted several hours and the inspectors interviewed patients who happened to be at the surgery that day, then talked with the GPs, nurse and reception staff. They also looked at various documents and the facilities. The only area identified for improvement concerned the website, which they thought needed to be updated. Considering the number and range of performance areas looked at, the surgery came out with flying colours and we are very lucky to have such an excellent service in our community.

SCHOOL NEWS

Key Stage 1 have been creating artwork based on their recent visit to Ickenthaite farm. They presented their work about the farm in a sharing assembly. In Design Technology they have been looking at Punch and Judy and how the puppets require sliding mechanisms to work.

Years 3 & 4 are studying 'special places' as part of Religious Education which incorporated a visit to the village church. Years 5 & 6 conducted a stream survey on a Mountains and Rivers field trip organised by the National Trust, visited the Quaker Meeting House, and partook in a 'Global Day' held at The Lakes School.

Years 5 & 6 are currently making preparations to enter a competition called 'Shaping the Future'. They are required to put together a power point presentation and are researching the life of Malala Yousafzai and her determination to ensure both genders receive equal access to education globally.

Forest School lessons have involved the children making world maps out of beautiful coloured leaves which were representative of rich and poor. The children held a fantastic debate about their choices. School pupils have exerted much effort into tidying the grounds and planting pots and hanging baskets.

MARKET HALL AGM: REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2013-2014

At the AGM on 13 May, the Trustees reported on the completion of the Diamond Jubilee Project which had taken 3 years and cost £69,926. It had provided a proper kitchen downstairs and a much more efficient boiler, new upstairs kitchen, new or refinished flooring throughout, improved lighting, new curtains, new tables and chairs, a fire alarm system and complete redecoration of walls, ceilings and woodwork.

A generous grant from the Outgate Reading Room Trust gave the Trustees the confidence to start this project. Financial support also came from the Hawkshead Co-op, the Outgate and Hawkshead WI, the Stage Society and the National Park Communities Fund (both for the new chairs), and the Hawkshead Freemasons.

The rest of the expenditure has been met from current revenues and some drawing-down of reserves.

Hawkshead now has a venue of which it can be justly proud. With no increase in prices, letting revenues were some 15% higher in 2013-14 as against the previous year (which was itself a significant improvement on the year before). In addition to regular user-groups, there is increased use by a range of outside organisations and as a wedding-reception location.

The Market Hall took part in Heritage Open Days in September 2012 with a display of artefacts connected with the old market, and welcomed a small number of visitors

The Trustees recorded their thanks to Mrs Jennifer Caldwell, Treasurer for the last three years, for her stewardship of the Market Hall's funds over this time and welcomed Mr Bill Marshall who has been co-opted as a Trustee to take her place as Treasurer.

HAWKSHEAD & SATTERTHWAITE FIRST RESPONDERS

This is not an appeal for money. We have enough in the kitty for the moment and we know how generously you respond when we do have to ask. But we do need some practical help.

First, we need help with our committee. Like any other charity, there has to be a committee to guide our affairs and, very importantly, to ensure that the money so generously given to us is safeguarded and properly spent. It's not an onerous job: usually two meetings a year. But we do need fresh blood, if that's not an unfortunate way to put it. The Secretary would like to be free to help with the training, the Treasurer, though still skilled with his abacus, would like some relief and the Chairman is getting decidedly long in the tooth. None need be active First Responders themselves: not all are at the moment. It is, however, an important and worthwhile contribution to the community and to a charity which deserves to be kept going.

Second, we have nine active First Responders at the moment, only the bare minimum to cover our large area, from Outgate to Bouth. We received 44 call-outs during 2013, 25 of which we were able to attend. So, we'd welcome new recruits. You'd be making a real and sometimes literally vital contribution to the community. New name, for a new district wide service

For the past 18 months, Cumbria Rural Citizens Advice Bureau has been expanding its service, to meet local demand for free, impartial and confidential advice. We now give advice 6 days a week, face-to-face or over the telephone, and have outlets at Ambleside, Grange-over-Sands, Kendal, Ulverston and Windermere. To better reflect our new improved service, we have changed our name to **'South Lakes Citizens Advice Bureau'**.

So how do you get advice? Simply telephone the Windermere office on 015394 46464. We help everyone. We do this by using a 'triage' type system, taking a few details from you to assess the urgency of your enquiry and then offering you an appointment or giving immediate help. Most of our advice is delivered by highly trained Volunteers, but we also have a few Specialist Advisers who give money advice. If you are in debt or struggling to make ends meet, do get in touch. We can help you make a budget and sort your debts into affordable repayments. The sooner you get advice, the better.

LAKELAND DISABILITY SUPPORT

Lakeland Disability Support is a grant-making trust, set up to help disabled people in South Lakeland. The purpose of the Trust is to give grants of financial assistance to help improve the quality of life for people in South Lakeland who have a physical disability.

Funding may be given for respite care, day care, equipment and services that will enhance the life of disabled people, and which the applicant or social services are unable to provide. It is not the purpose of the Trust to provide the primary support that is the responsibility of the local authority and long term funding will not be considered.

The Trustees meet quarterly, in January, April, July and October to consider applications, which will be considered on receipt of a completed application form, with supporting documents.
