Dear Friends,

I want to tell you about an exciting little experiment planned for Hawkshead parish church, which may well be in place by the time you read this. As many of you know, there is a book at the back of church where people can leave requests for prayer. It will be very discrete, but alongside this there will a touch screen in which people can type prayers if they wish. These will then be displayed on the screen below some candles. The prayers can also be projected onto a wall of the church, in a display especially designed to look like one of the 17th century wall paintings in the church.

Now for the odd bit: the only other similar installation is in the church of St Peter de Beauvoir in Hackney, London. The prayers left in that church (which is part of very different community from Hawkshead) also get displayed in our church, and the prayers left in Hawkshead get displayed there.

It is all the idea of Project CEDE (Creating and Exploring Digital Empathy), which is based at Lancaster University, Sheffield University and University College, London. They have devised (and paid for) this unique experiment to look at, among other things, how people respond to digital communication in a quiet and reflective environment, and whether any kind of relationship develops between Hawkshead and Hackney. It is also interesting from a spiritual perspective. People have come to offer the deepest part of themselves in our church for centuries. What does it mean to connect digitally with a very different church? It is an honour to be part of a one-off experiment like this, which examines ways of creating human empathy in the digital age. So come and have a look and see what you think.

HAWKSHEAD SCHOOL PROJECT - update July/August 2015

The subcommittee of the governors
continue to meet on a monthly basis
to discuss plans for the Pre- School
project. We anticipated that the
result of our planning application
would not be known until at least
the end of May, currently, this is the
case. Consequently, it has been
decided that the 'run in' period to
the proposed build this summer was
too short to commit to the planned
building and we have therefore
decided to postpone the project
until a hoped- for commencement
in summer 2016.

We have received donations and
offers of funding of approximately
£12,000 so far and the need to build
on this encouraging response
remains a high priority.

We will ensure the current building
will continue to be serviceable in the
interim. Discussion with the Pre-
School committee and staff
continues, to ensure provision of a
suitable and sustainable Pre-School
into the future. We remain

committed and optimistic despite
the disappointing delay.

The Local Government Ombudsman has recently found in favour of Ravenstonedale residents who argued that Cumbria County Council was avoiding its statutory obligations to provide free transport to pupils under 16 years of age, placing an "unfair" demand on parents to meet "substantial" costs themselves. SCHOOL NEWS

Year 5 & 6 have been learning about Holland. Pupils have written letters to their French pen pals. Geography saw the exploration and comparison of different areas including Saint-Sylvester, near Limoges in France.

Years 3 & 4 enjoyed a trip to Brockhole where they partook in orienteering, crazy golf and various games around the grounds. Key Stage 1 has practised their dances for the coming Rose Queen Gala event to be held on Saturday, 13th June, at school.

School assembly looked at the earthquake crisis in Kathmandu, Nepal. Forest school involved detective work. The children investigated different habitats including; hedgerows, woodland,

orchard and a bog! They discovered which plants flourished under which conditions.

School held a sharing assembly to bring half term to a positive close. Many parents and family members joined the children to learn about the work they have done. This included Key Stage 1 sharing work about geographical features of the world.

Years 3 & 4 have learnt about animal rights and years 5 & 6 shared their knowledge of Europe and France. After half term Key Stage 1 went on a trip to Langdale and explored Cathedral Quarries. They saw the well known Cathedral Cave. Pupils also enjoyed the discovery 'environmental watch' for birds and creatures on the walk up to the quarries. Years 5 & 6 have been on a residential visit to Haws End Outdoor Centre at Keswick. Activities have included canoeing, sailing and walking. Children were also expected to make their own beds and lunch independently - after all they are growing up!

Child Sexual Exploitation - The more you know, the more you see.

Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) involves offenders grooming youngsters and using their power to sexually abuse them. It can take many forms, whether it occurs through a seemingly 'consensual' relationship with an older boyfriend, or a young person having sex in return for attention, affection, gifts, alcohol or cigarettes. Cumbria Constabulary is committed to preventing child sexual abuse, helping victims and bringing offenders to justice. It is a crime that can affect any child, anytime, anywhere - regardless of their social or ethnic background.

Many young people who are being abused do not realise they are at risk and will not call for help. They may see themselves as willing participants when in fact their behaviour is anything but consenting. And, while there is no stereotypical victim of exploitation, there are warning signs in children's behaviour that may indicate something is wrong – and if you know what you're looking for, you can take steps to help them.

Car Travel Tips

As the holiday season is upon us, here are a couple of travel tips that may help you get about more easily. From 8 June, the DVLA has abolished the paper counterpart of the UK photocard licences. All endorsements, such as speeding offences, will be held electronically. If you commit an offence you will still have to pay any applicable fine and submit your licence to the court, but endorsements will no longer be recorded on the paper counterpart. You can view your record online, or request a copy by post (see www.gov.uk and type 'View your driving licence information' in the search box).

All of this means if you want to hire a vehicle, then you will no longer be able to show your paper counterpart or paper licence (pre- 1998). Instead you must obtain a unique access code (which expires after 72 hours) from the 'Share your Licence' online service and give this to the hire company along with the last 8 digits of your driving licence number. Alternatively you can call DVLA on 09061 393 837 and give permission for your driving record to be checked verbally by a nominated person/organization, but this may be difficult overseas or out of hours. Closer to home, did you know that Cumbria County Council has a 'Highways Hotline'? Phone them on 0845 609 6609 to report potholes, faulty traffic and street lights, anything to do with the condition of our roads. It's helpful if you have the precise location and the 3 number digit on the nearest lamppost. You can also report online, go to www.cumbria.gov.uk click on 'roads and travel' then 'report a problem/issue'.
