Dear Friends,

Trying to live ethically can be a complicated business. If I were to buy a bunch of roses, I do not know whether I am doing right by buying fair-traded roses from Kenya, or wrong because of carbon emissions created by flying them to England; right by helping a Third World country or wrong by ignoring locally-grown flowers. And if I cannot even sort out the rights and wrongs of a bunch of roses, I for one am very cautious about pronouncing on economic issues which I do not begin to understand. Nevertheless, the Bible insists that we do not forget the first principles of justice and equity. Both Isaiah and Micah in the Old Testament had a vision of how, if we would only follow God's way and God's law, swords could be beaten into ploughshares and there could be plenty for all. It is never too late to work instead for the justice and the peace and righteousness of God. However we conduct our affairs, whether as a community here or as a nation, we must do it with a vision of justice and peace for all.

School News

School returns after a wonderful, sunny summer to give a warm welcome to the new Reception intake and all existing pupils as they move up a year. New topics for the term include; Parliament and Law / Crime and Punishment, Forces and Friction for Years 5 & 6. Stone Age to Bronze Age, Changing Sounds, Light and Shadows for Years 3 & 4. Grammar School & Wordsworth, Cumbria Lakes / Aerial Views and Mapping, plus The Gunpowder Plot stand alone week for Key Stage 1.

Key Stage 1 enjoyed a visit to Wray Castle where they were included in a Peter Rabbit tea party. They have also visited The Abbott Hall Art Gallery as part of their art and history studies, partook in a portraits workshop and viewed the Museum of Lakeland Life. This was the first trip for our new Reception children and great fun was had by all. Years 1 & 2 have been drawing self portraits in Art. Key Stage 1 have benefitted from a history visit to Hawkshead Grammar School where they have seen the museum and learnt about how school life has changed. Additionally they have collected produce from Fletcher's Field for the coming Harvest Service. Key Stage 2 made 'story journey sticks' and have created Autumn Haiku's (Japanese Poem's) in forest school. Meanwhile the

garden boasts beautiful sunflowers and sweet peas, garlic and tomatoes. School club's comprising of cooking, art, chess/cricket and multi-skills, are all up and running.

Years 3 & 4 have enjoyed a trip to Brantwood at Coniston. They have been allowed to see and have a turn on the lithophone, also known as 'ringing rocks' and discover different ways in which sound travels. Another day trip took them to the Brewery Arts Centre at Kendal where they went to the cinema to watch 10 pieces of classical music. This really developed their understanding of the story behind the creation of a piece of music. Years 5 & 6 embarked on a day trip to London. They travelled on the train from Oxenholme, experienced using the London Tube, had a tour of the Houses of Parliament and went on a Duck Tour along the River Thames. They have also completed their Cycling Proficiency which has been delivered through Cyclewise. Year 6 have been to John Ruskin School to partake in a Creative Art and Music workshop.

BIBLE CAKE

In the nineteenth century it was considered to be an interesting test of Bible knowledge to write down the following recipe for a Bible Cake without having to turn up all the references. There is no doubt that the recipe is well known and the finished article should be highly appreciated.

One pound of I Kings, iv, verse 22
Half a pound of Judges, v, verse 25
Half a pound of Jeremiah, vi, verse 20
Half a pound of I Samuel, xxx, verse 12

Half a pound of Nahum, III, verse 12
Two ounces Numbers, xvii, verse 8
A pinch of Leviticus ii, verse 13
One tablespoonful of Amos, iv, verse 5
One tablespoonful of I Samuel, xiv, verse 19
Three tablespoons I Judges, iv, verse 19
Seasoned with II Chronicles, ix, verse 9

Bake at 350° F / 175° C in a greased 9 x 13' tin for approx 1 hour or until the edges pull away from the tin
