There are plenty of opportunities for the Hawkshead community to join in with Mitzvah Day activities. You can sign up at the Post Office in Hawkshead or by emailing info@hawksheadmitzvahday.com or by telephoning John Dixon on 015394 36301.

This year for Mitzvah Day, which is on Sunday 18th November, we have invited the refugee families who are living in Cumbria to have a trip to Hawkshead and the surrounding area. Due to the generosity and adaptability of local businesses and sponsors, we are able to offer all sorts of fun things for them to do- from mountain biking to a cruise on Windermere, from country walks to chocolate making, from music and dance workshops to a special showing of Paddington (with Arabic subtitles at Zeffirelli's), as well as activities in the 'Kittchen' and at Wray Castle. If you would like to join in with any of those please sign up (see above). We hope that some local families can join with these activities. All children must be accompanied by an adult. There will also be an afternoon tea for the community in the Market Hall to which anyone is invited (children must be accompanied by an adult). This will be between 3.30pm and 5pm. Tim Farron will be popping in. You are welcome to just come along to that, but to be certain of a place please do sign up.

The day will be rounded off with a ceilidh, a 'Klezmer Keilidh' in fact, starting at 6pm. Again, this will be in the Market Hall. On the evening before Mitzvah Day (Saturday 17th November), some Syrians will cook a Middle Eastern meal for the Hawkshead community in the Market Hall between 6pm and 8.30pm. Please sign up for this as quickly as possible.

This is a very exciting and unusual event and a real chance to have a cultural exchange and show some Cumbrian hospitality.

Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation

Main Aims:

- helping the poorest people get access to clean water and sanitation, to stop terrible diseases around the world;
- continuing to invest in cleaner water here in the UK.

Around the World

Increasing access to water and sanitation and delivering water and sanitation facilities was achieved between 2011 and 2015; the UK ensured that 64.5 million people gained access to these services. The government will continue to contribute to delivering Goal 6 by helping at least 60 million people gain access to clean water and sanitation by 2020. This includes ensuring that these services are sustainable and are resilient to future climate change, and that no-one is left behind in their provision. Programmes will be designed to build capacity in national and local authorities in a way that helps us reach the most vulnerable and marginalised.

In particular, the government is working to ensure that girls and women continue to be prioritised in the design and delivery of water and sanitation programmes. Girls and women are prioritised in the existing water and sanitation programmes, for instance by using women's membership of local water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) committees to ensure that their needs for safe facilities are met and their voices in local decision-making strengthened.

At Home

In the UK there is a successful system for the provision of clean water and sanitation services which, in England and Wales, are mostly provided by utility companies and regulated by Ofwat and the Drinking Water Inspectorate. According to the World Health Organisation and UNICEF

Joint Monitoring Programme for Water Supply and Sanitation, 100% of the UK has access to safe water.

Despite these strong foundations, the government continues to be committed to further investment in cleaner water. In February 2016 an updated River Basin Management Plan covering all of the UK was published. In England the plans build on work over the last five years to improve over 9,300 miles of our rivers.
