Dear Friends,

Imagine you are on a beach in summer (perhaps a challenge as autumn approaches). It is a perfectly ordinary beach. In fact, perhaps you might say it is a little too ordinary, a bit boring in fact. You put on a pair of goggles and go for a swim.

And, once in the water for the first time in your life, you see a tropical reef, just there not far below the surface. You are struck by the rich variety of colours, the iridescent profusion of fish, the wondrous patterns of corals and sponges and anemones. It is the most beautiful thing you have ever seen. It is all you can do to stop yourself laughing out loud, which would be a mistake with your head underwater.

When you climb out of the water you look back to where you have just been swimming. With the refraction of sun and sky and the turbulence of the waves, all you can see is an uninteresting shadowy rocky formation below the rolling sea.

We don't have to go to a tropical reef for something like that to happen. In all sorts of situations there can be moments when it seems like something falls away, and we see deeper, below the surface of everyday attention, and we get a glimpse of an unseen beauty and wonder that seems to expand our consciousness.

Perhaps those moments don't happen as often as we wish they would, but they can and do happen. A new angle on life can reveal to us the depth of beauty in places and people that we usually take for granted.

Approaching retirement? Not sure what to do?

Following pension reforms on April 6, people approaching retirement have greater freedom over how they can use their pension pots. People can take a lump sum, take out an annuity or a mixture of both. Pension Wise is a new Government service designed to help people make sense of their pension options, and empower them to make the right choices for them.

Individual face to face Pension Wise guidance appointments are now available to book, for those aged 50 or over. The guidance will help you understand your options to access your (defined contribution) pension pots after age 55.

To book your guidance appointment locally call into any South Lakes CAB outlet or ring us on 015394 46464 or contact the centralised booking number on 01900 68981. You can also find information on Pension Wise at www.pensionwise.gov.uk

Free, confidential advice and help is available from South Lakes Citizens Advice Bureau on any aspect of debt, consumer problems, benefits, housing, employment and any other problems. We have various outlets across South Lakeland and can also give advice over the phone – telephone 015394 46464 for an appointment and help.

Hawkshead and Sawrey Community Transport. Need a lift?

Perhaps you have an appointment at hospital and getting there is awkward, or you don't have transport to go shopping. If so, **Call 07808 508997** and a friendly volunteer will help you.

The cost is 30p per mile (which covers the cost of petrol and vehicle wear and tear). For example, a trip to Kendal and back from Hawkshead would cost about £11 and to Barrow and back about £16.
